

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- **How should my contributions be submitted?**

All abstracts must be uploaded directly within the registration form during the registration process. The abstract must be submitted by the presenting author, as only one person is allowed to present each abstract. All abstract should be submitted in English.

- **How should the submitted contributions be structured?**

Title – *Concise and descriptive. Avoid abbreviations.*

Authors & Affiliations – *Include the first name, last name, department/institution, and the email address of the presenting author and all co-authors.*

Introduction – *Provide concise context for the study. Outline the scientific or clinical problem being addressed and its significance.*

Methods – *Briefly describe the study design, key techniques or models used, and relevant analytical or statistical approaches.*

Results – *Summarize the primary findings. Include key data points, trends, or statistically significant outcomes. Results should be concrete and interpretable.*

Conclusions – *Interpret the findings and state their relevance or potential impact.*

Figures & Tables – *The maximum number of figures and tables altogether per abstract is two.*

- **Is there a limitation regarding characters?**

The limit for the title is 200 characters, including spaces. The abstract body should have a maximum of 3,600 characters, including spaces. The description text of figures and tables etc., References, Support & Funding, and Disclosure are not included in the total of 3,600 characters.

- **How many submissions should be allowed per author?**

This is unlimited.

- **Do you provide appropriate templates for the submission?**

The organizers do not provide appropriate templates for the submission, but all abstracts must comply with the formal requirements listed in this document.

- **Abstract Topics**

The relevant topics include hematological malignancies and cell-based therapies (basic, applied, translational research, or clinical report/study).

- **Encore Abstracts**

Encore abstracts are permitted, however new data is encouraged.
